Open calls targeting the green and blue bioeconomy

Right now, forest researchers in the Nordic region can apply for three different categories of funding from SNS: networking activities for five years, networking activities for one year and research projects running for three years. The deadline for all of the open calls is September 30th 2021. Here, you will find an overview of the calls.

Also, the BlueBio ERA-NET Cofund currently has an open call focusing on the sustainability and competitiveness of the blue bioeconomy in Europe. The submission deadline for the call is September 20th 2021, but there will be an additional call in 2022.

Blue bioeconomy actors in the Nordic and Baltic countries

In 2021, the Nordic Testbed Network has been expanded to include the blue bioeconomy. As part of this, we have conducted a mapping process to identify relevant actors within the blue bioeconomy in the Nordic and Baltic countries. Starting with a desktop study covering 10 countries, we identified 114 actors spanning from



private actors and science parks to research institutions and testbeds engaged in the blue bioeconomy. Following the mapping process, we have made contact with several new organisations engaged in digitalising the Nordic and Baltic bioeconomy.
